The European Theatre Convention (ETC) is the largest network of publiclyfunded theatres in Europe. We are co-funded by the European Union and have 65 members from more than 30 countries. Collectively, our theatres put on 60.000 performances for an estimated 16 million audience members each year.

Leading the way for European
Theatres to become climate neutral
by 2030

We will drive the ETC Membership towards net zero emissions by 2030 across their productions, buildings and operations. This programme includes an ambitious mixture of mentoring, peer-to-peer learning, and the rollout of the ETC Theatre Green Book. Theatres will be supported to track their progress through the ETC TGB Self-Certification process.

ETC's Next Theatre Generation Programme

A path from studies to the European Theatre Market for young artists. By connecting 3 long-standing ETC activities, we aim to accelerate the entry of young talents and theatre professionals into the European Theatre market. These are the European Theatre Academy of masterclasses at the Festival d'Avignon; the ETC Alumni Network of former participants in ETC activities; and the Professional Development programme of webinars, talks and workshops.

Supported by a collaboration with Fast Forward Festival at Staatschaupsiel Dresden/Germany, the Theatre National de Bretagne (TNB) in Rennes/France, and Oulu University of Applied Sciences in Oulu/Finland.

As an ETC Member Theatre:

- » Apply as a team for one of the 12 Digital Theatre development grants, for co-producing a digital theatre production or experimenting with new digital tools.
- » Apply as a team for one of the 8 Sustainable Theatre development grants, for collaboration ideas and experimentations in sustainable productions.

As someone working at an ETC Member Theatre:

- » Take part in one of the 5 webinars each year on key themes
- » Join one of the 4 on-site workshops to enhance your professional skills
- » Participate in ETC Conferences
- » Travel to an ETC Roadshow to an international performing arts market

As an artist:

- » Apply for the European Theatre Academy at the Festival d'Avignon (up to 15 scholars each year)
- » Fast Forward Festival Forum (up to 7 scholars each year)
- » TRANSMISSION Festival, (up to 2 scholars each year)
